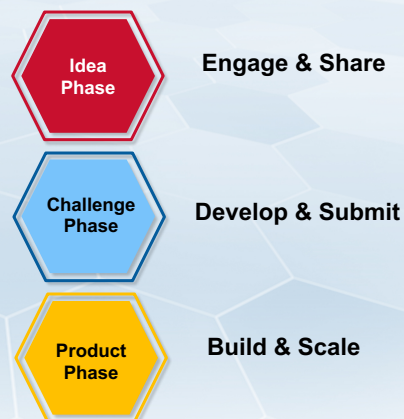


Finding innovative technology-based solutions that address critical needs in the opioid crisis

Challenge Phase Focus Topics



Diagnose

Rapidly identify individuals at high risk of addiction or overdose



Prevent

Eliminate or reduce urges, cravings or symptoms of withdrawal



Connect

Provide immediate and extended access for relapse or overdose interventions



Protect

Protect first responders from inadvertent exposure to toxic opioid levels
